Welcome to issue 10 of Up-date for Derbyshire Technical officials. Much has happened since the last issue of Up-date in January of this year and we are now well into the Track & Field Season having witnessed many outstanding performances from both our Endurance and Track & Field Athletes, ably supported by you our hardworking Technical officials. It has been very heartening this season to see so many new Trainee officials who are working very hard to achieve at least their Level 1 accreditation with others having already achieved L1 working towards Level 2. A timely reminder for those L1's working towards L2. As of 1st April this year a positive report from an official who is at least L3 in that discipline must be obtained and accompany the L2 accreditation application along with the RoE and the 2 Q&A papers Generic & Discipline specific. These must show also that the candidate has used the current UKA rules of competition.

Officials Education & Training

This year a Level 1 course will not be held in Derbyshire, the reason being that we are now sharing courses with Nottinghamshire the thinking behind this is that it is more sensible with Harvey Hadden Stadium being only 15 miles from Moorways (the venues where the courses are held) to have only one course in a year and to alternate venues. This year the L1 Course at Nottingham will be held on 2 dates - Wednesday 19th September 2018 7pm to 9pm at Harvey Hadden (this is a compulsory module for all Technical officials) and Saturday 22nd September 2018 for Field judging, Track Judging & Timekeeping. With Technology becoming more of a necessity (Po10 and all that,) rather than a Luxury we do need more younger Tech savvy people to come forward to learn how to set up and operate Photo-finish equipment and hopefully in the not too distant future Electronic Distance Measurement (EDM). The PF system is being upgraded very soon to include a 'Head-on Camera' and a 'Wireless' Track-side clock. At the moment all the Technical work in setting up is left to 1 person we really do need at least 2 other people willing to take on

this aspect of Photo-finish. Full training will be given as it is very expensive equipment, and if we do get an EDM device we will need some people capable and willing to look after, Set up, Calibrate and Operate it

The Derbyshire Athletics Committee.

Derbyshire Athletics is the Provider of competitions from County Championships to Mini-leagues. Both Track & Field & Cross Country and other Endurance races as well as 'Sportshall' The Derbyshire Athletics Committee is now down to about 6 ageing members. New Blood is needed to keep Derbyshire Athletics alive. Many people see Derbyshire Athletics as 'Elitist' or 'Exclusive' rather than 'Inclusive'. It is not! We need vibrant younger members on the committee to keep things 'Vigorous' and exciting, with new ideas and enthusiasm. Endurance (Road & Cross Country)

There are 24 Endurance Officials listed on Trinity (the UKA database) but I estimate that about 17 are active (our numbers are dwindling). Several Licences appear to have expired and if you do not have a Licence you can only work under someone who does have a current Licence. Remember too that to be a Referee you MUST have attended a Risk Awareness module. I am hoping to arrange a Level 1 Endurance Officials course – probably somewhere in Chesterfield area and mid-week in an attempt to avoid race days. Annual Records of Experience for Endurance should be sent to me (Barry Parker) as soon after 31st August as possible please.

If anyone has any comments or items to be included in Issue 11 of Up-date it will be going out in January 2019. Any 'Feed Back' is always welcome so that we know it is being read by those it is intended for.
