You are now able to complete your Track & Field and Endurance Record of Experience (RoE) online. It is a simple process to do and for those looking for an up-grade it is extremely beneficial to use it. Firstly follow this link;

Then log in to your portal as normal using your URN (licence) No and Password. On the left hand side of the screen appears a number of options, select Record of Experience and a new page will appear titled 'Record Of Experience' scroll to the bottom and click on 'Add New' a new smaller window will appear for you to complete, when you have completed all the relevant fields in the window remember to scroll to the bottom and click 'Save' The details will then appear in your 'Online' RoE. There is of course a 'However' and that is could you please also fill in the usual version of the RoE and send it on the relevant date as we cannot access your 'Online' version yet. You have to export it to us at the relevant date and we know many of you are not comfortable with using the 'Trinity' data base.

GOOD NEWS! Recently the Officials Training and Education Sub-groups made the momentous decision to recognise Timekeeping as a separate discipline for Endurance events (at last). The Bad news with this is that Timekeepers can only achieve Level 1 as Endurance officials. To get to Level 2 or higher it is necessary to carry out a number of other tasks such as Starting, Starters assistant, Funnel judge, Funnel recorder, etc. Endurance Officials are expected to be versatile and able to work in any sub-discipline.

Sad News from Nottinghamshire.

We were informed in October that Jack Walters, 'Gentleman Jack', a very long serving and very well liked Timekeeper from Nottinghamshire was very ill and in Hospital, sadly Jack passed away on 21st October aged 87 years. His Funeral held at a packed Bramcote Crematorium was on 8th November. There were very many colleagues from the world of Athletics Officiating and Derbyshire as a County Association was very well represented. I can only say that Track & Field and Cross Country Championships will be the poorer without him.
